Minutes of the Executive Committee Meeting Southern Ohio Section of the American Association of Physics Teachers Saturday October 11, 2008

The meeting of the Executive Committee of the Southern Ohio Section of the American Association of Physics Teachers (SOS/AAPT) was called to order by President F. Reuter at 12:30 PM in Room 164 of the Brehm Laboratory Building of Wright State University in Dayton, Ohio. Those present were Gordon Aubrecht (The Ohio State University), Jennifer Blue (Miami University), Darwin Church (University of Cincinnati), Elizabeth George (Wittenberg University), Frank Huss (Cincinnati Observatory Center), Frederick Reuter (St. Xavier High School), James Sullivan (University of Cincinnati), and Eric Towers (Summit Country Day School).

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by F. Reuter and approved by the body.

President F. Reuter announced that the SOS/AAPT had received final approval as a 501(c)(3) organization and presented the associated papers to Treasurer G. Aubrecht. Mark Reuter had submitted the appropriate request to the IRS on a pro-bono basis after spending much time getting the needed information from members of the SOS/AAPT and organizing it into the appropriate format. It was moved and seconded that Mark Reuter be made an honorary life member of the SOS/AAPT – the motion passed unanimously.

President F. Reuter reminded the group that the data base of members had been distributed electronically and a paper form was available at the meeting. Those present were invited to make corrections. Also the new SOS/AAPT Membership Brochure was distributed by President F. Reuter.

The spring, 2009 meeting has been tentatively scheduled at Shawnee State University (SSU) in Portsmouth, Ohio - Jim Simmons, SSU, is the person in charge. The Ohio Area Section of the American Physical Society is scheduled to meet at Ohio Northern University (ONU) in Ada, Ohio on April 24-25, 2009 – Mellita Caragiu, ONU, is the person in charge. The spring meeting of OS/APS at ONU was a complete surprise to the officers of the SOS/AAPT and several SOS/AAPT officers were informed of this on Friday October 10th. Ada, Ohio is in the geographical territory of the SOS/AAPT and it has been the policy of the SOS/AAPT to meet with the OS/APS whenever the OS/APS meets in the territory of the SOS/AAPT. M. Caragiu personally asked several officers of the SOS/AAPT to meet with the OS/APS at ONU and will change the official meeting poster and documents if the SOS/AAPT is able to join the meeting. J. Sullivan was authorized to contact J. Simmons, SSU, after this meeting to determine the state of planning at SSU for the spring meeting and determine if it would be a serious inconvenience for them to delay their hosting of an SOS/AAPT meeting to a later date. In the event the SOS/AAPT will meet with the OS/APS at ONU in April, 2009, G. Aubrecht was authorized to contact M. Caragiu, ONU, to inform her the SOS/AAPT would attend and G. Aubrecht would then serve as the SOS/AAPT person in charge of that meeting."

A similar problem occurred in that the SOS/AAPT officers had learned (again within the past day) that OS/APS planned to meet in the October of 2009 at Ohio Wesleyan University (OWU) in Delaware, Ohio (again in the SOS/AAPT territory). The SOS/AAPT had previously planned to meet at Summit Country Day School (SCD) and the Cincinnati Observatory Center (COC) in the fall of 2009 but F. Huss and E. Towers agreed to delay the SCD/COC hosting to a later date in order to permit a joint meeting with OS/APS at OWU.

Therefore future planned meetings are as follows:

Spring, 2009 Ohio Northern University, Ada OH with OS/APS (G. Aubrecht)

Fall, 2009 Ohio Wesleyan University, Delaware OH with OS/APS

Spring, 2010 University of Cincinnati Clermont College, Batavia OH (D. Church)

Fall, 2010 Eastern Ohio (possibly Marietta) with Appalachian Section / AAPT

TBD SCD/COC Cincinnati OH

TBD SSU Portsmouth OH

President F. Reuter will extend gratitude on behalf of the SOS/AAPT to the appropriate persons at Wright State University and the Air force Institute of Technology for hosting this meeting.

In an attempt to improve membership in the SOS/AAPT, F. Reuter moved the following: Through June 30, 2009, (1) a senior (age 65+) can obtain life membership for \$100, (2) new members can join for two years for \$10 (2 for 1), and (3) a member who signs up two other new members gets one year of his/her dues free. The motion was seconded and after a short discussion the motion passed unanimously.

J. Blue gave the Section Representative report from the Edmonton, Alberta meeting of the national AAPT. Some AAPT sections have become inactive and others may be formed. Future AAPT meetings are February, 2009 Chicago II (with AAAS), Summer 2009 Ann Arbor MI, Winter 2010 Washington DC, Summer 2010 Portland OR, Winter 2011 Jacksonville FL, Summer 2011 Omaha NE, and Winter 2012 California.

Treasurer G. Aubrecht reported that \$700 was forthcoming from OS/APS for awards at the spring 2008 State Science Day. The current balance on hand is \$2972.02 and (with the anticipated \$700) our available cash should be \$3672.02. Life members were discussed and it was determined that we had 24 known life members. Cash should be kept in (higher) interest-bearing accounts to offset expenses for these life members. J. Sullivan was authorized to contact our bank to determine feasibility of changing our checking account to reflect our new tax-exempt status. Treasurer G. Aubrecht was authorized to alter and establish bank accounts, as he deems appropriate, in order to safely maximize the SOS/AAPT income. Both authorizations passed unanimously.

President F. Reuter was authorized to compose and send a letter to life members thanking them for their continued membership and pointing out that we are now a 501(c)(3) organization and that all donations are tax-deductable.

A motion to adjourn was made, seconded and unanimously approved at 1:38 PM.

Aubrecht informed Mellita Caragiu (via e mail on October 11, 2009) of the SOS/AAPT's desire to accept her invitation to jointly meet with the OS/APS at Ohio Northern University on April 24-25, 2009.

The Executive Committee meeting of the Southern Ohio Section of the American Association of Physics Teachers was called to order by President Frederick Reuter at 10:05 AM. The meeting was held in the Advanced Physics Laboratory (Room 304) of the Science Building at Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio.
